### 04. FIRST AID MEASURES

If Poisoning occurs, contact a doctor or the poisons information Centre

#### **Inhalation**

Remove the victim from exposure- avoid becoming a casualty. Remove contaminated clothing and loosen the remaining clothing. Allow the patient to assume the most comfortable position and keep warm. Keep at rest until fully recovered. If the breathing Laborde and patient is cyanotic (blue), ensure airways are clear and have a qualified person give oxygen through a facemask. If breathing has stopped apply artificial respiration at once. In the event of cardiac arrest, apply external cardiac massage. Seek immediate medical advice.

#### **Skin contact**

For gross contamination, immediately drench with water and remove clothing. Continue to flush skin and hair with plenty of water (and soap if the material is insoluble). For skin burns, cover with a clean, dry dressing until medical help is available. If blistering occurs, do NOT break blisters. If swelling, redness, blistering, or irritation occurs seek medical assistance. A component of this material can be absorbed through the skin with resultant toxic effects. Seek medical advice.

#### **Eye contact**

If in eyes wash out immediately with a large amount of water. Seek medical attention.

#### **Ingestion**

## 06. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURE

### Minor spill

Extinguish naked flames. And avoid sparks. Wear protective equipment to prevent skin and eye contamination. Wipe out with absorbent (clean rag or paper towel) or absorb with sand, sawdust or earth. Collect in drums, and arrange for disposal by a competent contractor, in accordance with local regulations.

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### Major spill

Shut off all possible source of ignition. Clear area of all unprotected personal. Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so. Slippery when spilt. Avoid accidents, clean up immediately. 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These exposure standards are guides to be used in the control of occupational health hazards.
